



Entry forms may be received via email or mail. If Entry cards are to be returned, please allow time for them to be processed. The preferred method of entry is online at www.albanyshow.org.au. Please contact the office if you require assistance filling out the forms.
- 3. The committee reserves the power to reject or remove any exhibitor, servant or attendant, or any visitor from the Show without being required to give any explanation or being liable

- for compensation. The powers conferred on the committee shall be delegated to the Secretary and all monies won by such offenders shall be forfeited.

8. **PUBLIC VIEWING OF EXHIBITS:** Pavilion doors will be open to the public at 9:00am Friday 7th November 2025. All Exhibitors must pay an entry fee into the show grounds on show days and adhere to the rules of the Agricultural Society.

#### **CONDITIONS FOR ENTERING EXHIBITS**

- All work exhibited in these sections must be the work of the individual exhibitor and must have been finished between November 2024 and November 2025, although it may have been in progress over any length of time.
- No article or work, which has previously been exhibited at the Albany Agricultural Show, is eligible to compete.
- 3. All ages mentioned in Schedule refer to age as of registration close date 23 October 2025.
- 4. No group entries are accepted unless stated.
- 5. Please check other sections before entering under "any other article".
- DO NOT mark your name, initials, or signature on your exhibits. Exhibits must be judged anonymously. Any exhibits with these markings will be excluded from judging.
- 7. Please ensure you ADHERE TO CLASS RESTRICTIONS. Any exhibits that do not adhere to the specifications of a class e.g. the size, materials etc. will be excluded from judging.
- Please attach your entry ticket securely to your exhibit. Exhibits without an entry ticket attached cannot be judged.
- REFUND OF ENTRY FEES No refunds will be given for exhibits or memberships.
   If an exhibit is withdrawn, rejected, or disqualified by the Albany Agricultural Show for any reason, the entry fee will NOT be refundable.

#### 10. JUDGING

- 1.1. Judging commences in all classes at 10:00am Thursday 6th November 2025.
- 1.2. No person other than Stewards and Judges will be allowed in the exhibition area after benching is completed at 10.30am Thursday 6th November 2025. i.e., during judging.
- 1.3. Judges ARE NOT permitted to show in any class in which they may be involved in judging.
- Prizes will be awarded at the Judge's discretion. First prize is not necessarily awarded.
- 1.5. In the event of there being no competition in any particular Class, prizes may be given if the Judges certify to particular merit.

  However, they are specifically requested to with-hold prizes even where there is competition if the exhibits are of inferior

- description, or not suitable for the class in which they are competing, they may be awarded a 2nd prize.
- 1.6. In case of tied points in any section, the Most Points prize will be awarded to the person with the most 1st prizes followed by 2nd and 3rd prizes if necessary.
- 1.7. Any entry deemed to be in the incorrect class by either the Stewards or Judges may be moved to a more appropriate class.
- 1.8. Judge's decisions are final. Any formal complaint must be in writing addressed to the Councillor in Charge at the Society's office.

#### 11. AWARDS AND PRIZES

- 1.1. The Winner of the Bella Swainston Trophy will be determined by a People's Choice Award. The winner is voted for by the public during the Show. The People's Choice Award is kindly sponsored by the Swainston Family
- 1.2. Trophies will be presented in the Pavillion on site Saturday 8th November 2025 between 4:00pm and 4:30pm.
- 1.3. The collection of Class Prize Money and Special Awards will happen between 5:00pm and 6:00pm on Saturday 8th November 2025 in the pavilion when exhibitors are permitted to collect their exhibits.
- 1.4. Exhibitors must present their exhibitor place cards to collect their prizes.
- 1.5. Any prizes not collected will remain in the Albany Agricultural Society office on Cockburn Road and will be available for collection during office hours for up to 7 days following the show. Uncollected exhibits will be donated to charity.

#### **ADDITIONAL RULES**

Please read the rules on pages 6-8 of this program. Additional rules include:

- Embroidery must be the dominant feature of all entries.
- Any names, initials or markings on the work must be covered to ensure fair judging.
- Condition of the exhibit piece must be clean and presentable (no visible marks or stains), article can be laundered by the exhibitor.

#### HAND EMBROIDERY

Class 21 White Work Embroidery

Any article using white, cream or ecru threads and fabric.

Class 22 Counted Thread Embroidery

Any article using white or coloured threads and even weave fabric. Includes pulled fabric, Hardanger, satin stitch, Kogin and decorative darning. Excludes canvas work and cross-stitch pictures.

Class 23 Cross-Stitch Small

Wall hanging, picture or screen. Includes samplers and texts. Beads and embellishments acceptable. The visible area shall not exceed 45cm in any direction, including fabric surround. Measurement does not include mounting.

Class 24 Cross-Stitch Large

Wall hanging, picture or screen. Includes samplers and texts. Beads and embellishments acceptable. The visible area shall not exceed 100cm in any direction, including fabric surround. Measurement does not include mounting.

Class 25 Wool Embroidery

Any article of wool embroidery (no synthetics). Excludes canvas work.

Class 26 Mixed Media

Any article. Minimum 50% hand embroidered.

Class 27 Smocking

Any article featuring smocking. Seams may be machine sewn.

Class 28 Miniature Embroidery

Includes petit point, stump work, needle painting, etc. Embroidered area not to exceed 8cm in any direction.

#### HAND EMBROIDERY .../ Cont.

#### Class 29 General Hand Embroidery

Any article of general embroidery stitches, any fabrics and threads allowed. May include collage, beading and metal thread work. Preprinted designs and hoop embroidery allowed.

#### Class 30 Wall Panel, Picture or Screen

Any type of stitchery other than needlepoint tapestry or cross-stitch. May include embellishments. Please provide hanging attachments. Maximum size not exceeding 45cm by 65cm, including frame.

#### Class 31 Embroidered Homeware Article

May include a tablecloth, table centre, table runner, set of mats or a cushion cover. Any type of hand embroidery may use coloured fabric or threads.

#### Class 32 Original Embroidery

Any article. Exhibit must be worked from an original design of the exhibitor. Photocopy evidence of original design, e.g. drawing, photograph or chart MUST be included. Free use of any type of hand embroidery.

#### Class 33 Canvas Embroidery

Must be worked on canvas. The visible area shall not exceed 45cm in any direction, including fabric surround. Article should be framed or otherwise suitable for hanging. Please provide hanging attachments.

#### Class 34 Any Article

Any other article of HAND embroidery for which a class is not provided.

#### Class 35 Contemporary Embroidery

Piece of contemporary embroidery (slow stitches) – can include embellishments.

#### Class 36 Feature Class - Sunflower

Piece of hand embroidery featuring sunflower.



#### **ADDITIONAL RULES**

Please read the rules on pages 6-8 of this program. Additional rules include:

- All exhibits must state the name of fibres used and attach a sample on a plain white business sized card enclosed in plastic.
- All skeins must indicate intended purpose written on sample card.
- All skeins must be tied with same yarn as skein.
- All exhibits must be hand spun by the Exhibitor.
- Any article or skein that does not include a sample of the fibre will not be judged.
- Entries with identifying brands, stud labels, business names will not be judged.
- No article may be entered in more than one class.
- All exhibits in classes 39 to 46 must be skeins.
- All exhibits in classes 47 to 51 will be judged on their construction and finish as well as the quality of spinning.
- All skeins must weigh a minimum of stated weight. And must not exceed a maximum of 10g over that weight.

E.g. 50g must be between 50g - 60g.

NOTE: scales will be provided at the Agricultural Society Office from 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2025.

#### **JUDGING CRITERIA**

Skeins of Yarn:

- Suitability of fleece/fibre for end use and to indicate intended purpose written on sample card.
- Evenness of spin and ply.
- Suitability of washing and scouring and of skein ties to prevent tangling.
- Handle and presentation.

#### Articles Made Up:

- Choice of yarn for pattern use; appropriate needle or hook size for knitted or crocheted exhibits.
- Evenness of knit crochet or weave, density of fringes, or quality of hand sewn hems.
- Finishing: steam pressing, blocking or fulling.
- Applied finishes, buttons, bindings, etc.
- Making up: finishing off, neatened seams, clipped ends, etc.
- Handle and presentation.

#### HAND SPINNING CLASSES

Class 39 50g Skein Wool - Novice

Novice Spinner having under 2 years' experience. Must be spun from raw

fleece.

Class 40 50g Skein Wool - Undyed

Must be spun from raw fleece.

Class 41 50g Skein Wool - Natural Dye

Must be spun from raw fleece. Dyed using natural dyes. State dye source and method e.g. Cordata, Eucalyptus,

Coreopsis, Madder.

Class 42 50g Skein Roving/Top Dyed/Undyed

May be any commercially combed wool/wool blend fibre, dyed or undyed by the Exhibitor or commercially done. E.g. merino/silk,

wool/alpaca.

Class 43 50g Skein Chain Plied

Any yarn spun with the chain plied

method.



- Please note there are separate classes for 'Professional Quilters' and 'Amateur Quilters' this year. Please refer to the below description of a 'Professional Quilter' before entering.
- All Quilts must have a hanging sleeve attached to the back no smaller than 3 inches in width by length of the quilt

#### **PROFESSIONAL**

A Professional Quilter is defined as someone who teaches or publishes in the field of quilting, sells, designs or participates in the making of quilts for financial gain; and/or has won Best of Show or two First Prizes in any major judged competition. 'Financial gain' is any amount above the cost of creating any article, teaching aid, including samples, notes and travelling expenses.

If you are a 'Professional Quilter' according to the above criteria, please enter your articles in classes 104-109.

#### Class 107 Pictorial Quilt

Any design or technique depicting a recognisable image. Size not exceeding 2.5m in length and width.

#### Class 108 Other Patchwork/Quilted Article

Any other article of patchwork or quilting that does not fit into any of the above. Such as a bag, cushion or garment. Excluding Dolls and Toys. Size not exceeding 1.5m in length and width.

#### Class 109 THEME - Sunflower

#### Class 112 Traditional Quilt

Hand or machine pieced using traditional techniques or design. Size not exceeding 2.5m in length and width.

#### Class 113 Pictorial Quilt

Any design or technique depicting a recognisable image. Size not exceeding 2.5m in length and width.

#### Class 114 Other Patchwork/Quilted Article

Any other article of patchwork or quilting that does not fit into any of the above. Such as a bag, cushion or garment. Excluding Dolls and Toys. Size not exceeding 1.5m in length and width.

#### Class 115 THEME - Sunflower
