

At the completion of the Creative Craft Competition, trophy winners should take their trophy to *The Trophy Shop* for their name, section and year to be engraved. The Albany Agricultural Society will have an account set up at *The Trophy Shop* to pay for this.

Winning a trophy entitles the exhibitor to hold the trophy for eleven months, returning it to the secretary one month prior to the following show.

- 1. The Society's Annual Show is held under the Society's Rules and Regulations. The committee may add, alter, vary or revoke any Rules and Regulations it may deem advisable.
- 2. No exhibit shall be staged for competition until subscription or entrance fees are paid to the Society. Fees may be paid by direct credit, cheque, EFTPOS or cash. Entry forms may be received via email or in person at the Society Office on Cockburn Road.
- 3. The committee reserves the power to reject or remove any exhibitor, servant or attendant, or any visitor from the Show without being required to give any explanation or being liable for compensation. The powers conferred on the committee shall be delegated to the Secretary and all monies won by such offenders shall be forfeited.
- 4. NO DOGS. Only registered Assistance Dogs or dogs for exhibition/competition, will be allowed on the grounds.
- 5. The committee reserves the right to postpone, and further postpone any Show from the advertised date, and may make any alterations it deems desirable in the schedule of prizes, or other show arrangements.
- 6. The decision of the Society on all points shall be final and without recourse.
- 7. NO GATE ENTRY FEE AND/OR MEMBERSHIP FEES WILL BE REFUNDED.
- 8. Quantities, weights and numbers will be strictly adhered to.
- 9. All persons competing and exhibiting in the Show do so at their own risk.
- 10. No protest will be considered if person protesting has not an entry in the class concerned.
- 11. The Head Steward of each section reserves the right to reject and remove from the ground any exhibit, which is in their opinion dangerous or objectionable.
- 12. The Albany Agricultural Society Incorporated Committee will not be held liable for loss of or damage to the exhibitor's property whilst on the grounds.
- 13. Stewards reserve the right to re-enter an entry into a more appropriate section and/or class.



1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

Pavilion doors will be open to the public at 9:00am Friday 10th November 2023.

Entries to be submitted online at www.albanyshow.org.au

Assistance for online entries is available at the Albany Agricultural Society Office located at 88 Cockburn Road.

All entries close 4:00pm Monday 6th November 2023. NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED.

E-mail and posted entry applications are discouraged this year. Please seek assistance from staff at the Albany Agricultural Society Office if you need help entering online, or contact the Creative Craft Councillor.

<u>DO NOT</u> mark your name, initials, or signature on your exhibits. Exhibits must be judged anonymously. Any exhibits with these markings will be excluded from judging.

Please ensure you <u>ADHERE TO CLASS RESTRICTIONS</u>. Any exhibits that do not adhere to the specifications of a class e.g. the size, materials etc. will be excluded from judging.

Please attach your entry ticket securely to your exhibit. Exhibits without an entry ticket attached cannot be judged.

2. ENTRY RESTRICTIONS

A maximum of three (3) entries per exhibitor per class, unless otherwise stated.

An entry consists of one (1) item, unless otherwise stated.

Any exhibit may be entered in only one class.

3. CONDITIONS FOR ENTRIES

All work exhibited in these sections must be the work of the individual exhibitor and must have been finished between November 2022 and November

2023, although it may have been in progress over any length of time.

No article or work, which has previously been exhibited at the Albany Agricultural Show, is eligible to compete.

All ages mentioned in Schedule refer to age as of 1st November 2023.

No group entries are accepted, EXCEPT in Patchwork classes 141 and 142, where Commercial Quilting is permitted, and Hand Spinning Class 73 where a second person must be acknowledged.

Please check other sections before entering under "any other article".

4. REFUND OF ENTRY FEES

No refunds will be given for exhibits or memberships.

If an exhibit is withdrawn, rejected, or disqualified by the Albany Agricultural Show for any reason, the entry fee will NOT be refundable.

5. JUDGING

Judging commences in all classes at 10:00am Thursday 9th November 2023.

No person other than Stewards and Judges will be allowed in the exhibition area after benching is completed at 9:30am Thursday 9th November 2023. i.e., during judging.

Judges ARE NOT permitted to show in any class in which they may be involved in judging.

Prizes will be awarded at the Judge's discretion. First prize is not necessarily awarded.

In the event of there being no competition in any particular Class, prizes may be given if the judges certify to particular merit. However, they are specifically requested to with-hold prizes - even where there is competition if the exhibits are of inferior description, or not suitable for the class in which they are competing, they may be awarded a 2nd prize.

In case of tied points in any section, the Most Points prize will be awarded to the person with the most 1st prizes followed by 2nd and 3rd prizes if necessary.

Any entry deemed to be in the incorrect class by either the Stewards or Judges may be moved to a more appropriate class.

Judge's decisions are final. Any formal complaint must be in writing addressed to the Councillor in Charge at the Society's office.

6. AWARDS

All exhibits are automatically eligible for a People's Choice Award. The winner is voted for by the public during the Show. The People's Choice Award is kindly sponsored by

Trophies and Special Awards (Best Overall, Runner Up Best Overall and Most Points) will be presented in the Society Meeting Room (see map and signs) on Saturday 11th November 2023 between 4:00pm and 4:30pm.

The collection of Class Prize Money and Special Awards will happen between 5:00pm and 6:00pm on Saturday 11th November 2023 in the pavilion when exhibitors are permitted to collect their exhibits. Exhibitors must present their place cards in order to collect their prizes.

Any prizes not collected will remain in the Albany Agricultural Society office on Cockburn Road and will be available for collection during office hours following the show.

7. COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS

No exhibit is to be removed before 5:00pm Saturday 12th November 2022. Access to displays will be restricted between 4:30pm and 5:00pm to allow Stewards to dismantle them ready for collection between 5:00pm and 6:00pm. Exhibits will only be released on presentation of entry receipt or written permission of entrant.

Any hand knitted article, using any fibre or combination.

Main portion of exterior of bag to be constructed with a woven fabric such as canvas, cotton, poplin, muslin etc.

Any article using white, cream or ecru threads and fabric.

Class 38 Counted Thread Embroidery

Any article using white or coloured threads and even weave fabric.

Includes pulled fabric, Hardanger, satin stitch, Kogin and decorative darning. Excludes canvas work and cross-stitch pictures.

Class 39 Cross-Stitch Small

Wall hanging, picture or screen. Includes samplers and texts. Beads and embellishments acceptable. The visible area shall not exceed 45cm in any direction, including fabric surround. Measurement does not include mounting.

Class 40 Cross-Stitch Large

Wall hanging, picture or screen. Includes samplers and texts. Beads and embellishments acceptable. The visible area shall not exceed 100cm in any direction, including fabric surround. Measurement does not include mounting.

Class 41 Wool Embroidery

Any article of wool embroidery (no synthetics). Excludes canvas work.

Class 42 Mixed Media

Any article. Minimum 50% hand embroidered.

Class 43 Smocking

Any article featuring smocking. Seams may be machine sewn.

Class 44 Miniature Embroidery

Includes petit point, stumpwork, needle painting, etc. Embroidered area not to exceed 8cm in any direction.

Class 45 General Hand Embroidery

Any article of general embroidery stitches, any fabrics and threads allowed. May include collage, beading and metal thread work. Pre-printed designs and hoop embroidery allowed.

Class 46 Wall Panel, Picture or Screen

Any type of stitchery other than needlepoint tapestry or cross-stitch. May include embellishments. Please provide hanging attachments. Maximum size not exceeding 45cm by 65cm, including frame.

Class 47 Embroidered Homeware Article

May include a tablecloth, table centre, table runner, set of mats or a cushion cover. Any type of hand embroidery, may use coloured fabric or threads.

Class 48 Original Embroidery

Any article. Exhibit must be worked from an original design of the exhibitor. Photocopy evidence of original design, e.g. drawing, photograph or chart MUST be included. Free use of any type of hand embroidery.

Class 49 Canvas Embroidery

Must be worked on canvas. The visible area shall not exceed 45cm in any direction, including fabric surround. Article should be framed or otherwise suitable for hanging. Please provide hanging attachments.
